
Church Etiquette

For those whose mothers and grandmothers are still alive – may we cherish them today and every day. May we honor them and thank them for their 'calling' to motherhood. For those whose mothers have fallen asleep in the Lord, may they remain vibrant in our hearts, alive and present within our family conversations, and always in our prayers. As most internet searches will show.

Mother's Day was established in the United States (Philadelphia) by the efforts of Anna Jarvis in 1909. Since then, the idea of honoring our earthly mothers has spread across the globe to be a tradition held by Christians, Jews, and Muslims. Our mothers carry us in their wombs- the first home of the whole human race. They taught and nurtured us on the countless roads of life, by offering wisdom, patience, and practical experience. As Christians, we can say with certainty that our heavenly mother, Mary, the Mother of God, was and still is a role model for all earthly mothers whom we remember, honor, and celebrate.

From the Annunciation to the Crucifixion, Mary, the Mother of our Lord, shows us all the patterns of human love surrendered to God's love and finding its fulfillment in Jesus Christ. So, while we rightly honor our moms, let's honor our churches each and every day, because the Church is our mother as well.

The fact that we call her "Mother Church" is no accident. It reveals a beautiful mystery of our century's old faith. The expression "Mother Church" is more than sentiment – and much more than piety, it is reality.

From the moment we enter those waters, we die with Christ and are raised to New Life in Him. We are baptized into Christ – and now live in Him, with one another, for the sake of the world.

Dear faithful sons and daughters, as we pause from the frantic shopping for temporary Mother's Day gifts, the numerous internet searches for a 90 minute dining experience, or a dash to a florist for flowers lasting maybe 6 days, may we lovingly offer our prayers to God for our mothers and our churches by recalling a portion of "A Mother's Hands" by Baroyr Sevag, when he says "...Come, let us dutifully kiss these hands today, these hands which bore and nursed us, which kept us in this world and cherished us, which washed and dusted for us, ever guiding, ever toiling; These hands, though chapped and roughened, are for us silk-smooth hands, true-blue hands.". Yes, God has indeed blessed our mothers.



Jesus Heals Peter's Mother-in-law

Mat. 8:14, When Jesus came into Peter's house, he saw Peter's mother-inlaw lying in bed with a fever. He touched her hand and the fever left her. Mark 1:29-31, As soon as they left the synagogue, they went with James and John to the home of Simon of Andrew. Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with fever, and immediately they told him of her. And he came and took her

by the hand and lifted her up, and the fever left her; and she served them. Luke 4:38-39, Jesus left the synagogue and went to the home of Simon. Now Simon's mother-in-law was suffering from a high fever, and they asked Jesus to help her. So, he bent over her and rebuked the fever, and it left her. She got up at once and began to wait on them. While the three accounts are very short, they have some interesting differences of detail: In Matthew's account it is Jesus who heals Peter's mother of his own volition rather than being asked to, as in the other two accounts. In both Mark and Luke's accounts, they call Peter by his earlier name-Simon, and the healed woman gets up and immediately wait on "them" whereas Matthew says she rose and waited on "him" only. There are interesting variations on how Jesus healed the woman. Matthew says he touched her hand; Mark says Jesus took her hand and Luke says that Jesus bent over her. At that time, if a Jewish person touched someone who was sick, they would become unclean. Jesus is defying the rules while remaining undefiled. Since Matthew is writing to a Jewish audience this even would be scandalous. Whereas Mark emphasizes the servant nature of the story with the idea of taking the woman's hand and then helping her to stand up. And she in turn serves him in gratitude. As Luke is a doctor he includes more medical elements in his accounts- he bends over the woman to heal her just as a wise doctor he includes more medical elements in his account- he bends over the woman to heal her just as a wise doctor knows the importance of a good bedside manner. Only Luke states that she had a high fever. In Jesus' time, a doctor would have assessed the severity of the fever first, and so Luke would have wanted to know the precise details of this episode to ensure that he recorded the facts accurately in his gospel. This would have given his account real medical authority and therefore, be received as a genuinely true miracle. Luke also says that Jesus rebuked the woman's fever. We have no idea what kind of fever this was or what caused it since in the ancient world there were many Hebrew and Aramaic names for fever and several remedies used against it. Nevertheless, on a later occasion, Jesus famously rebuked the wind and the waves to end a storm on the Sea of Galilee in Luke 8:24. And Luke also used word 'rebuke' when Jesus casts out a demon during and exorcism in the Capernaum synagogue in Luke 4:35; as well as on other occasions against the disciples. When Jesus rebuked something or someone it implied that evil was present, and therefore the evil must be identified and called out for the healing to happen. In the Bible, demon possession covered all types of psychic or physical reactions caused by spiritual forces not ordained by God.


